# 6 CORNWALL COUNCILLOR'S COMMENTS

Cllr Keeling reported that

- there are natural concerns about the impact relaxation of the lock-down might have during the course of the coming week-end
- Police will be working with teams from Cornwall Council during the week-end and will not hesitate to insist on observance of the law
- he understands that four public houses within his division intend opening, that the majority of residents want the lock-down to continue and that local businesses believe that current guidance lacks detail
- in case of illness, visitors to the county will be advised to contact their own doctor or dentist: they will not be treated at a local surgery
- he understands that, should a local lock-down become necessary, the whole of the county (rather than individual communities and specific areas) will be included
- he continues to promote the *Twenty's Plenty* initiative and hopes that a gateway scheme similar to that proposed for Tregonning Hill will be implemented on the A394 at Breage and Ashton
- reported Planning Enforcement allegations are on the increase and the teams are beginning to be in a position to follow them up. Concerned residents are advised to take photographs of their concerns and to forward those to Cornwall together with their allegations
- he met Mr Derek Tomas MP recently and was pleased to be told that the Government's proposed Shared Prosperity Fund will wholly replace EU structural funding

#### 8 PARISH MATTERS

# **Footbridge to the Church**

The Clerk reported that Roger McLean has quoted the sum of £1,272.00 for the repair of the bridge over the stream on Germoe Green and that, following e-mail correspondence with Councillors, he had instructed Mr McLean to go ahead with the necessary work. In order to regularise that instruction, Cllr Blencowe proposed and it was agreed to accept Mr McLean's quotation.

#### **Gateway Scheme**

The Clerk reported that he had received both an acknowledgment of Germoe Parish Council's written agreement of Cornwall Highways' proposals and notification that the scheme is now included in the Community Network's Highways Scheme. Cllr Blencowe stated that, while the planned gateways look to be going through, there has been no mention of the replacement of the 40mph repeater signs: it may be that Germoe Parish Council will have to underwrite these.

# **Climate Emergency**

Cllr Blencowe reported that the emerging Climate Change Development Plan is designed to be a supplementary planning document and will affect all significant policies.

# 9 PLANNING

## To make observations on planning applications including the following

PA20/03928 Mr Musgrave – Change of use of land for domestic purposes and construction of a double garage – Hillside, Tresowes Hill. Cllr Blencowe proposed, Cllr Praed seconded and it was agreed that this application should be returned with the following observation

# Historic Significance of the Site and Setting

The buildings, garden and small field enclosure that form the current "Hillside" property are clearly shown in the 1877 Ordinance Survey Map sheet LXXV.7. The property is set within a portion of Tregonning Hill Conservation Area that retains many small field enclosures that provide evidence of Croft Farming which was an important element of the local historic mining community. The arrangement of house, subordinate outbuildings, small garden and attached small field have survived largely intact since 1877 and are characteristic of properties in this area that provide strong visual evidence of "mineworkers' small holdings".

#### Policy Issues

1. The proposed change of land use would result in the loss of 40% of the original open field space and would considerably increase the density of buildings and parked vehicles in this countryside location. This would significantly harm the legibility of this historic site and would neither preserve nor enhance visual appreciation of the site contrary to the specific requirements of CLP Policy 24 Development within the Cornwall and West Devon Mining World Heritage Site. This would also be contrary to the requirements of CLP Policy 2.1 Spatial Strategy which requires development to respect and enhance the quality of place and would be contrary to the requirements of CLP Policies 23 and 24 which assert that new development should maintain the special character and appearance of the Conservation Area and maintain the character and distinctive landscape qualities of the Area of Great Landscape Value.

- 2. The exceptional size, scale and height of the garage would create a building that is inappropriate in relation to the main residence and to its' historic setting. The dominance of the garage in relation to the residential property would be compounded because the garage is a two-story building set upon a ground level of that is considerably higher than that of the main residence. This would be contrary to the design requirements set out in CLP Policy 12, 1a
- 3. By virtue of size, mass and position the building would be overbearing and overshadowing upon the wider setting and those members of the public who use the adjacent footpath to access the Tregonning Hill Country Wild-

Life Site and the Tregonning Hill Conservation Area. The proposed building would also obscure the public view of the valuable open space that is a defining characteristic of the setting. This would be contrary to the requirements of CLP Policy 12, 2b.

4. First floor windows on the north aspect of the proposed building would directly overlook the private garden and conservatory of the neighbouring property. This would not protect individuals and property from overlooking and unreasonable loss of privacy. This would be contrary to the requirements of CLP Policy 12, 2a.

Bearing in mind the above issues Germoe Parish Council requests the Planning Authority to refuse permission for development.

PA20/04621 Mr R.Abbott – Proposed first floor extension – Wayfield Cottage, Newtown. Cllr Blencowe proposed, Cllr Bell seconded and it was agreed that this application should be returned with the following observation *Germoe Parish Council supports this application*.

#### **Decisions**

PA20/03710 APPROVED - Construction of a second storey rear extension - 7 Trewithen Terrace - noted

#### 10 FINANCE
